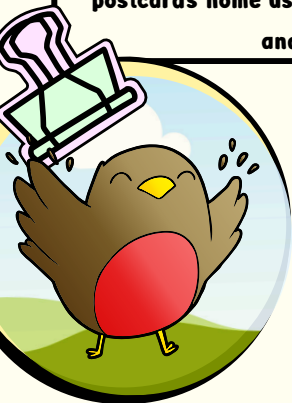


Robins Curriculum Map

Term 3

Writing

This term, we will be taking a virtual trip to the tropical island of Tobago through our class book *Gregory Cool* by Caroline Binch. We will explore what life is like on this sunny island and bring our learning to life through our SPaG focus on past tense, prepositions and prefixes. Our lessons will build up to writing a diary entry describing a day in Tobago, followed by our very own postcards home using prefixes to add detail and interest.



Reading

This term we will be reading from a range of different genres. Our reading lessons will focus on:

- Vocabulary
- Inference
- Prediction
- Explanation
- Retrieval
- Sequence

We will begin the term by exploring the powerful story *Freedom Soup* by Tami Charles.

We will also continue to enjoy our gripping class read for pleasure each afternoon, *The Great Crisp Robbery* by Pamela Butchart, and we can't wait to uncover who the mysterious hooded figure really is!



Maths

Our focus this term is place value and number. Now that we are in Year 3 we are ready to explore much bigger numbers, we will focus on numbers to 100 before moving onto numbers to 1000! Developing our skills is addition, subtraction, partitioning, problem solving and reasoning as we move throughout the term.



Science

Our Science topic this term is Diet and Nutrition. We will be learning about the five food groups and why humans need the right types and amounts of food to stay healthy. Children will explore what makes a balanced diet, compare different diets, and learn about animal diets, including herbivores, carnivores and omnivores. Through practical activities and discussion, we will develop our understanding of how food helps our bodies grow and stay strong.



Learning Journey

Geography

Our topic this term is Maps. We will be using atlases to explore the UK and the wider world, learning about lines of latitude and longitude, the Equator, hemispheres, and time zones. Children will develop their map skills and begin to understand how places around the world are connected.

French

In French, we will be enjoying a text study of *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* in French. Through this familiar story, children will develop their listening skills and begin to use simple French vocabulary and phrases with confidence.

PE

This term in PE, our focus will be Gymnastics. Children will develop strength, balance and flexibility as they practice movements, shapes and sequences. PE will continue to take place on a Friday morning.

Music

We will be finding inspiration through the artwork of Jackson Pollock who is famous for his emphasis of process, emotion, and the unconscious- moving away from traditional representation of art towards pure abstract pieces.
