News

We would like to wish you all a very Happy New Year and hope you all had a great rest over the Christmas holidays. We are all looking forward to another busy and exciting term ahead.

We are on the classroom gate every afternoon and there is always a member of the reception team on the gate in the morning for you to talk to if you wish to discuss anything.

We have an exciting new topic this term. In Term 3 we will be looking at Journeys through Traditional Tales. Therefore each week we will focus on a different traditional tale and children will have the opportunity to complete a wide range of activities themed around a familiar story. We will act stories out and write and tell our own versions.

The stories we will look at this term include—The Three Billy Goats Gruff, The Three Little Pigs, Goldilocks and the Three Bears, Little Red Riding Hood, The Gingerbread Man and also Hansel and Gretel.

We are desperately hoping the weather will be kind this term so we can make the most of our outside learning space. But we will still go out regardless. We are planning some den building in our forest school area.

Ways in which you can help your child with this topic would be to read them other versions of traditional tales and then encourage them to retell stories they have learnt at school. Acting out a story with toys and puppets is a great way for children to use story telling techniques.

PE— Takes place every Friday. Children are to come into school in their PE kits with a school jumper. Plain black joggers or leggings in this colder weather, not patterns or colours please.

Literacy

The children have now learnt all the letter names and sounds and are practising blending these together to make simple three letter words consonant, vowel consonant words. We focus on segmenting the individual sounds and then blending them together to read the whole word. This helps us with our writing too. We are now starting to write simple sentences through scaffolding the structure of a sentence.

Maths



Much of our Maths teaching will continue to be through play based activities. We will also be using Number Blocks as starting points to our teaching. This term we will extend our numbers to 20 and continue counting beyond. We are starting to apply addition and subtraction concepts to our learning as well as combining sets of numbers. We will be looking at identifying shapes and repeating patterns

Phonics & Reading

In Reception we will be using Read, Write Ink, to teach the children their sounds, this term they will be learning digraphs—two letters to make one sound.



Please read with your child and ensure you write in their purple book so we can change their reading books regularly. I cannot stress enough the importance of reading at home with your child. Please also read them a bedtime story, it is precious time together.

Term 4 Topic

Our topic in term 4 is 'People and Vehicles Who Help us'.

We will be looking at the different organisations who help us including the RNLI, Ambulance service, Police, Fire Service, Builders, Farmers and Vets.

We will also be looking at the role these people play in our lives and what their jobs involve and how they are important to us. As well as the vehicles and equipment they use.



In term 4 we are hoping to have a trip to Mrs Lockwood's Family farm, where they will see a working farm in action and see the lambing. Fingers crossed that Covid doesn't hinder us!

Outside Learning

The children will have access to the outside area during their Challenge sessions everyday, in all weathers.



Please ensure that you provide your child with suitable coats and footwear, if possible a pair of wellingtons that could stay at school.

Outdoor learning is a great way for children to explore and enquire about their environment. We will spend lots of time outside!



Books

Please encourage your child to look at or read a variety of books. Sharing books together with your child is a rewarding experience for all. Children love a trip to the library and a bedtime story. We love when children bring in a story book to share with the class!

Home Learning

Home Learning is given out on Friday to be returned the following week by Thursday. These activities are a chance for you to talk about what your child has been learning and for you to share an activity based on our topic to be completed at home with your child.
